ECT (ELECTROCHEMOTHERAPY) - HOME CARE NOTES

- Recommendations include wearing gloves, avoiding high-pressure sprays. A bucket of water should be used to wash away urine, if using towels to mop up an accident disposable towels or piddle pads are best.
- Solid items should be removed with gloved hands and bagged with impermeable disposable bags for household wastes.
- Liquid wastes should be blotted dry.
- The area should be cleaned with detergent and dilute bleach once all evidence of visible contamination is removed. Gauze, wipes, or paper towels should be sprayed directly, and then used to wipe the surface.
- Cat litter boxes should be cleaned daily and litter should be bagged and discarded with household trash.
- Any soft items (e.g., bedding, towels, toys) should be washed separately from other laundry, and ideally bleached.
- If indirect contact with contaminated urine or faeces of a patient occurs, the skin should be rinsed with water and washed using dishwashing detergent for a minimum of 5 minutes, in accordance with recommendations for chemical exposure and any additional instructions from a personal physician followed.
